

DATABASING AND GEOREFERENCING HISTORICAL COLLECTIONS TO DISCOVER POTENTIAL SITES FOR RARE AND ENDANGERED PLANTS OF NEW YORK, U.S.A.

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ABSTRACT

Over 400 years of natural history inventories of preserved specimens and vouchers in museums and research institutions are now important repositories of invaluable information and permanent records documenting life on earth. Plant collections, in particular, play roles in understanding climate change, conservation modeling, molecular and medicinal studies, invasive-species management, and biodiversity assessments. Researchers reexamine these collections in order to establish conservation priorities for threatened and endangered taxa. Herbarium specimens, spanning many decades, can provide data on a natural population's geographical range and its shift over time. Although historical specimens provide valuable information about past distributions, label information may lack geographic coordinates or precise locations, or may have descriptions that are too vague or confusing to be useful. Here we present a case study for plant specimens collected by Thomas F. Lucy in the late 1800's in Chemung County, New York. The goal of this research was to determine if Lucy's label localities could be improved using historical land use and topographic maps, and georeferenced using Google Earth®. Lucy documented 134 plant families for the Chemung County area: 106 species of flowering plants (ca. 982 taxa, excluding hybrids), 12 fern and fern allies (48 taxa), 13 mosses (21 taxa), and one species each for lichens, liverworts, and algae. Nine taxa are noteworthy for the state of New York. Fourteen taxa are listed as endangered, threatened, or unknown: *Chaerophyllum procumbens* (Apiaceae), *Arabis shortii* (Brassicaceae), *Cacalia suaveoleus* and *Lactuca floridana* (Compositae), *Carex retroflexa* (Cyperaceae), *Hydrangea arborescens* (Hydrangeaceae), *Allium cernuum* and *Chamaelirium luteum* (Liliaceae), *Liparis lilifolia* and *Platanthera hookeri* (Orchidaceae), *Polygonum erectum* (Polygonaceae), *Lysimachia quadrifolia* (Primulaceae), *Geum virginianum* (Rosaceae) and *Vitis vulpina* (Vitaceae). Nine other plants are recommended for protection: *Panax quinquefolius* (Araliaceae), *Rudbeckia fulgida* (Compositae), *Carex conjuncta* (Cyperaceae), *Pterospora andromedea* (Ericaceae), *Aesculus glabra* (Hippocastanaceae), *Epilobium ciliatum* (Onagraceae), *Cypripedium arietinum* (Orchidaceae), and *Calamagrostis porteri* and *Panicum scoparium* (Poaceae).

RESUMEN

Más de 400 años de inventarios de historia natural de especímenes conservados y testigos en museos e instituciones de investigación son actualmente importantes almacenes de información invaluable y registros permanentes de la vida documentada en la tierra. En particular, las colecciones de plantas juegan un rol importante en la comprensión del cambio climático, modelos de conservación, estudios moleculares y médicos, gestión de especies invasoras, y evaluaciones de biodiversidad. Los investigadores reexaminan estas colecciones con el objetivo de establecer las prioridades en la conservación para aquellos taxones amenazados y en peligro. Los especímenes de herbarios, que abarcan varias décadas, pueden aportar datos del rango geográfico de una población natural y su cambio a lo largo del tiempo. A pesar de que los especímenes históricos provean información valiosa sobre distribuciones pasadas, la información etiquetada puede carecer de coordenadas geográficas o de localizaciones precisas, o pueden contener descripciones demasiado vagas o confusas como para ser útiles. Aquí presentamos un estudio de un caso para especímenes de plantas recogidos por Thomas F. Lucy a finales de siglo XIX en Chemung County, Nueva York. El objetivo de esta investigación es determinar si las localizaciones etiquetadas de Lucy podían ser mejoradas utilizando usos históricos del terreno y mapas topográficos, y georreferenciados utilizando Google Earth®. Lucy documentó 134 familias de plantas para el área de Chemung County: 106 especies de plantas con flores (ca. 982 taxones, excluyendo híbridos), 12 helechos y relacionados con helechos (48 taxones), 13 musgos (21 taxones) y una especie de cada uno de los siguientes grupos: líquenes, hepáticas y algas. Nueve taxones son dignos de mención para el estado de Nueva York. Catorce taxones se encuentran listados como en peligro, amenazados, o desconocidos: *Chaerophyllum procumbens* (Apiaceae), *Arabis shortii* (Brassicaceae), *Cacalia suaveoleus* y *Lactuca floridana* (Compositae), *Carex retroflexa* (Cyperaceae), *Hydrangea arborescens* (Hydrangeaceae), *Allium cernuum* y *Chamaelirium luteum* (Liliaceae), *Liparis lilifolia* y *Platanthera hookeri* (Orchidaceae), *Polygonum erectum* (Polygonaceae), *Lysimachia quadrifolia* (Primulaceae), *Geum virginianum* (Rosaceae) y *Vitis vulpina* (Vitaceae). Nueve otras plantas son recomendadas para la protección: *Panax quinquefolius* (Araliaceae), *Rudbeckia fulgida* (Compositae), *Carex conjuncta* (Cyperaceae), *Pterospora andromedea* (Ericaceae), *Aesculus glabra* (Hippocastanaceae), *Epilobium ciliatum* (Onagraceae), *Cypripedium arietinum* (Orchidaceae), y *Calamagrostis porteri* y *Panicum scoparium* (Poaceae).

vulpine (Vitaceae). También se recomienda la protección de otras nueve plantas: *Panax quinquefolius* (Araliaceae), *Rudbeckia fulgida* (Compositae), *Carex conjuncta* (Cyperaceae), *Pterospora andromedea* (Ericaceae), *Aesculus grabra* (Hippocastanaceae), *Epilobium ciliatum* (Onagraceae), *Cypripedium arietinum* (Orchidaceae), y *Calamagrostis porteri* y *Panicum scoparium* (Poaceae).

INTRODUCTION

For over 400 years, natural history inventories have been conducted throughout the world, resulting in preserved specimens or vouchers housed in museums and research institutions worldwide, representing over 350 million specimens (Thiers, continuously updated). These inventories resulted in a variety of studies on flora and fauna from local checklists to highly detailed monographs. Collections, along with their associated label information, are proof that certain taxa existed in a specific place and time. In the past, specimens were the fundamental tools for taxonomy and systematic studies, but now that role is expanding to include molecular work, georeferencing, and other technologically advanced fields.

Plant collections, in particular, now play roles in climate change research (Abu-Asab et al. 2001; Lavoie & Lachance 2006; Robbirt et al. 2011), conservation modeling (Ferrier 2002; Funk & Richardson 2002; MacDougall et al. 1998; Mace 2004), and molecular (Ames & Spooner 2008; Castro & Menale 2004; O'Gorman et al. 2008) and medicinal (Eisenman et al. 2012) studies. Herbarium specimens can be used to document spatio-temporal distribution of exotic species (Barney et al. 2008; Delisle et al. 2003) and to guide invasive-species management (Carter et al. 2007; Woods et al. 2005) and biodiversity (O'Connell et al. 2004) assessments. In determining conservation priority for threatened or endangered taxa, it is important to understand the population's natural extent and biogeographical range, and how its range has shifted over time (Farnsworth & Ogurcak 2006). Label data from recently collected specimens (i.e., the past 50 years) generally have current identifications and more precise locality data, and may have geographic coordinates such as latitude/longitude or UTM coordinates. Historical specimens, likewise, contain valuable locality data; however, lack of geographic coordinates, vague or incomplete descriptions, and/or references to places no longer in existence make using these data challenging. Before geospatial analyses is performed, the information associated with a collection (e.g., written description of location, date, and habitat) must be captured in a database, either through data entry or through automated processes. Variability in label information format, locality name abbreviations, completeness, and quality may require revisions to the initial data entry before assigning GPS coordinates.

Here we present a case study for plants collected by Thomas F. Lucy in the late 1800s in the Chemung County area of New York (Fig. 1). The goal of this research was to: 1) develop a database from the BUF-Lucy collection and generate labels, 2) consolidate all the Lucy collections into a database, update the nomenclature, and georeference specimens, 3) identify historical localities of plant taxa now rare and endangered, and those recommended for protection in New York, and 4) produce a map of potential sites for these plants.

Background

Thomas F. Lucy (1844–1906) spent approximately thirty years collecting botanical specimens in the Chemung River Valley of New York (Kelloff et al. 1990; Kelloff & Kass 1993). His herbarium, along with the collections of other local botanists, contributed to Clute's (1898) *Flora of the Upper Susquehanna and its Tributaries*, and completed a series of local floras spanning from Lake Ontario to Eastern Pennsylvania. Meticulously annotated and mounted, Lucy's specimens were part of the natural history collections of the Elmira Academy of Sciences (Kelloff & Kass 1993). Eventually, Elmira College acquired the collection (Brooks 1900), which became the core of the Elmira College Herbarium (ECH, Table 1). This collection was studied and annotated at the college by Dr. Stanley J. Smith (later Curator at the New York State Museum at Albany) in 1945 and 1947 (Smith 1945). It was then “lost” until 1984, when it was rediscovered in the back of a storage room. The collection was ultimately moved to the College's Carnegie Science Hall, where it was databased (Kelloff et al. 1990; Table 1). In 2000, the L.H. Bailey Hortorium Herbarium (BH) at Cornell University received the Lucy herbarium (ECH-Lucy) from Elmira College. Revision of the nomenclature began (Graver et al. 2005).

Further research indicated that the Buffalo Museum of Science (BUF) was the main repository for Lucy's herbarium (Chaudhri et al. 1972; Kelloff & Kass 1993). Correspondence with Robert Zander, then curator at

BUF, confirmed that BUF did have Lucy's collections (Letter R. Zander, to the authors, 21 Jan 1986; Table 1); however, most were un-mounted, still in period newspaper, and stored in boxes. The authors originally believed these to be duplicate specimens of the ECH-Lucy herbarium; but after further examination discovered that Lucy continued to collect plants. Thomas Lucy and his wife, Emma, moved to Buffalo, New York in June of 1900, where he died in 1906. His collection, along with others from the Buffalo Botanical Garden Herbarium, was later transferred to BUF (Eckel 1990). Without adequate labels, BUF was considering disposing of the collection to make room in the herbarium; but BUF agreed to keep the collection if labels could be made. ECH arranged to have the collection sent to the U.S. National Herbarium (US).

MATERIALS AND METHODS

Databasing the BUF-Lucy collection and generating labels




Fig. 2. Two examples of Thomas F. Lucy's notes on scrap paper found with the specimens. Top: Aug 6, 1882, Sullivan Hill. Bottom: on Big Island, bank of Chemung River, April 28, 1897.

The BUF-Lucy collections were not without information. Lucy had annotated the bottom corner of the newspapers with the Patterson (1892) species number. Within the sheets, along with the specimens, he included notes on scrap paper (Fig. 2) briefly providing the location, date, habitat, and other miscellaneous information. Although the information was not always clearly written, our previous research with the ECH-Lucy collection was helpful in reading his handwriting and understanding the resources he referenced (Kelloff et al. 1990; Kelloff & Kass 1993).

Care was vital in handling the brittle 100-year-old newspapers, as Lucy penciled Patterson's number for species determinations on the lower edges. Sometimes a second number enclosed in a "box" or circle was penciled near the Patterson number: these referenced Oyster's (1888) numbers for species determinations from the 2nd edition of *Catalogue of North American Plants*. Lucy studied *Salix* while in Buffalo (not part of this paper) and occasionally cited Andersson (1867). In the database, an abbreviation such as "Sul. Hill" is typed Sullivan Hill or "Ch. R." for the Chemung River. Tobacco farming became popular in Chemung County in the late 1800's and large plantations were given names like Blazing Star, Sunrise, and Fruit Homestead (Pierce 1879). Since these locations were familiar to Lucy, he used abbreviations such as "F.H." and "Fruit H." in his notes. Where words or names could not be read, data entry workers used brackets and the illegible word would appear as Cl[], [illeg.] or [].

About 30% of the collection had preprinted labels (occasionally blank or with data filled in), which Lucy




Fig. 3. New label generated from the information found with the collection, including any references to Patterson (1892), Heller (1898), and Oyster (1888) checklists.

used when he exchanged specimens. Five different preprinted label headers were found: Flora of New York, Flora of the Upper Waters of the Susquehanna, Herbarium Americanum, Herbarium Novum Yorkum, and Flora Americae Septentrionalis. Before 1880, Lucy had used handwritten labels in red ink (for images see Kelloff et al. 1990 and Kelloff & Kass 1993). The BUF-Lucy database (Table 1) included all information found with the specimens and new labels (Fig. 3) printed for all collections. Once the collection had labels, BUF received a full set of specimens and a copy of the database.

Merging the ECH-Lucy (completed in 1985) and BUF-Lucy databases facilitated updating the nomenclature. Lucy tended to use various references (Gray et al. 1890; Torry Botanical Club 1894) and checklists (Heller 1898; Mann 1872; Oyster 1888; Patterson 1892) that did not always agree on species determination. On the ECH-Lucy specimen labels, Lucy would cite multiples references when the nomenclature differed. Understanding the literature used and how the classification varied helped in updating the nomenclature. Several resources were utilized: on-line databases (USDA & NRCS 2015; Royal Botanic Garden Kew et al. 2013; Missouri Botanical Garden 2015; ITIS 2012), monographs (Clausen & Smith 1939; Coulter & Rose 1888; Greenman 1915; Jones 1946; Kruschke 1964; McNair 1925; Nesom 1997; Pimenor & Leonov 1993; Rydberg 1913; Williams 1937), books (House 1924; Mitchell & Tucker 1997), citations to Lucy's collections (McNair 1925; Williams 1937) and specialist annotations.

Merging all Lucy collections into a Master database and georeferencing the collection

A master database (Table 1, Lucy-Master) was generated by merging all the records from the BUF-Lucy and ECH-Lucy databases with Lucy collections found at J.F. Bell Museum of Natural History Herbarium (ABSL), Cornell University (BH), Brooklyn Botanic Garden (BKL), Boise State University (Boise St U), Buffalo Museum of Science (BUF), George Safford Torrey Herbarium (CONN), Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh (E), Elmira College (ECH, now housed at BH), Field Museum of Natural History (F), University of Michigan (MICH), Missouri Botanical Garden (MO), W.S. Turrell Herbarium (MU), C.E. Bessey Herbarium (NEB), New York Botanical Garden (NY), New York State Museum (NYS), Ohio State University (OS), Muséum National d'Histoire Naturelle (P), University of Wyoming (RM), University of Missouri (UMO), U.S. National Herbarium (US), University of Wisconsin (WIS), and SEINet, a consortium of herbaria databases from the United States.

Many place names in Lucy's 100-year-old locality data referred to farms (Harrington, Rutan, Lowman), watersheds (Hendy Creek, Seeley Creek), people (Mrs. Cranes, Tremain, Tubbs), businesses (Old Grist Mill, Paynes Shops, Woolen Mill) and roads that have changed names (River Road, Plank Road, Latty Brook Road). Historical accounts of the county (Towner 1892) also provide clues to locations like "Hammond's Corner" and

"Blazing Star Farm," and geological studies provided locations of quarries (Clarke & Luther 1905). Lucy's original collection localities were found using historical land use maps (Beers 1869; Pidgeon 1896; Rea & Tremble 1853; Miller et al. 1904), topographic maps (U.S. Geological Surveys 1969a-h), driving guides to historical trails (Chemung Valley History Museum 2006), and Google Earth®. For example, the mill pond in Pine Valley was found on a 1869 map (Beers 1869) and appears as an outline in Google Earth® (Fig. 4). The farm of Alfred Searles, Fruit Homestead (Fig. 5), demarcated in the (Beer) 1869 map of Ashland, later became part of the Newtown Battlefield State Park (Anon. 1922). The island locally known as Harrington Island (Anon. 1897, 1930) appears on late 1800 maps as Baldwin Island (Fig. 4 & 6).

Sorting the Lucy-Master database by date provided a way of comparing localities with possible duplicate specimens. A sedge collected on 11 Jul 1896 and sent on exchange to CONN and MO listed "Elmira" whereas the BUF specimen listed the more precise description "along Newtown Creek, above Woolen Mills." The Woolen Mills, found on historical maps, were on Clark Street in Elmira. Although Clark Street no longer exists, Google Earth® shows the site as an open field with a "shadow" of Clark Street still visible.

A number of computer-based, automated georeferencing tools, such as GEOLocate (Rios & Bart 2010) and BioGeomancer (Guralnick et al. 2006), can process large numbers of records; but for this project, and

because of the age of the collections, spatial coordinates from the locality information were manually determined on a specimen-by-specimen basis. It is possible to narrow down historical collecting sites using maps, Google Earth®, and other resources. The goal was to provide the best fit for each locality (Chapman & Wieczorek 2006; Garcia-Milagros & Funk 2010), with the understanding that each specimen location was an estimation of the actual collecting site.

RESULTS

BUF-Lucy database and generating labels for the unmounted collections from The Buffalo Museum of Sciences (BUF).

The BUF-Lucy database had over 2700 records and more than 2525 plant specimens (ca. 4900 individual sheets/duplicates), contributed by 123 individual collectors, including prominent botanists of the day: Charles F. Millspaugh, Amos A. Heller, Henry H. Rusby, and Henry N. Patterson (see Tilden et al. 2008 for more details on the collectors). The collection numbers varied from single collections to as many as 15 duplicate sheets. BUF

received a full set of specimens with newly-generated labels as well as all original notes and labels found in the collections. Smaller sets of duplicates with new labels (and sometimes original labels, if available) were distributed to Smithsonian Institution (US), L.H. Bailey Hortorium Herbarium (BH), Elmira College Herbarium (ECH, as duplicates were already at BH), New York Botanical Garden (NY), Missouri Botanical Garden (MO), University of Michigan Herbarium (MICH), and New York State Museum (NYS).

The collection from BUF-Lucy comprised more than just unmounted duplicates of the ECH-Lucy collection (Kelloff & Kass unpublished data; Tilden et al. 2008). Although Lucy's collection constituted the bulk (over 77%) of the BUF-Lucy herbarium, only 42 specimens were duplicates from Elmira (ECH-Lucy).

Merged databases and georeferencing the Lucy collections

Label data varied between institutions. Lucy did not use consecutive collection numbers, as is the general practice today. Instead, his collection numbers varied according to his needs or those he exchanged with, and included Patterson or Heller checklist numbers (flyer, Smithsonian Institution Archives; see Fig. 1 in Kelloff et al. 1990), a "cat. no." from the Mann (1872) checklist or a collection number that would be used for a species regardless of the place or date that specimen was collected, or no number at all (i.e., s.n.). In addition, since the labels were handwritten or "stamped," Lucy seldom provided all the information on specimens sent out on exchange. To find possible duplicate collections between institutions, the date and the identification became the unique identifier. In some cases, Lucy's collection practices and lack of a clear locality prevented the connection.

The Lucy-Master database comprises over 5200 plant records collected by Lucy or acquired in exchange. Filtering the database for "Lucy" and "Chemung County" found over 2740 specimen records from approximately 270 unique localities. This list became the foundation of the annotated checklist (Appendix).

When compared to the 1105 taxa in Clute's (1898) *Flora of the Upper Susquehanna* (which encompasses a little over seven counties), Lucy's survey of the plants of Chemung County was extensive. In all, Lucy documented 134 plant families just in the Chemung County area: 106 species of flowering plants (ca. 982 taxa, excluding hybrids), 12 fern and fern allies (48 taxa), 13 mosses (21 taxa), and one species each for lichens, liverworts, and algae.

The Lucy collection documents a number of notable species from Chemung County. Lucy discovered two new taxa: *Xanthium arcuatum* Millsp. & Sherff (Holotype F, Millspaugh & Sherff 1918) and *Prenanthes trifoliolata* (Cass.) Fern. forma *leptomera* Sherff (Holotype F, isotypes F, BH; see Appendix). In a letter now attached to his collection of *Prenanthes* at the Field Museum, Lucy stated that this taxon [which he originally named *Prenanthes altissimus dissecta*] is "worthy of even specific rank," as it "follow[s] in the involucre as to color and form" but is "widely divergent" in leaf color and size, standing nearly 7 feet tall.

His collections included 23 taxa of conservation interest: 14 taxa listed as endangered, threatened, or unknown (Mitchell & Tucker 1997; see Table 2), and nine additional plants recommended for protection (Mitchell & Sheviak 1981) because of loss of habitat or over-collecting: *Aesculus glabra* Willd. (Hippocastanaceae), *Calamagrostis porteri* A. Gray (Poaceae), *Carex conjuncta* Boott (Cyperaceae), *Epilobium ciliatum* Raf. (Onagraceae), *Panax quinquefolius* L. (Araliaceae), *Panicum scoparium* Lam. (Poaceae), *Pterospora andromedea* Nutt. (Ericaceae), *Rudbeckia fulgida* Aiton (Compositae), and *Cypripedium arietinum* R. Br. (Orchidaceae, which is recommended for High Priority) (see Appendix for herbaria where specimens are deposited).

Using the Lucy-Master database, approximately 86% of Lucy collections from the Chemung County area had sufficient locality data to add spatial coordinates. Since the range of error for each locality will vary depending on the detail provided, the latitude/longitude are estimates or starting points for relocating extant populations of these plants. Many areas in Chemung County, New York, where Lucy collected, are still undeveloped, including Mt. Zoar Hill, areas of Pine City, Van Etten Swamp, Greatsinger's Corner, Jenkins Woods, and Mountain House Narrows (aka Old Mountain House Narrows). Established as parkland in 1879, Sullivan Hill still has much of the woods surrounding the hilltop. Two maps generated from the coordinates in the




FIG. 7. A map plotting all known collecting localities of Thomas F. Lucy in Chemung County, New York.




Fig. 8. A map plotting all possible areas for taxa of conservation interests collected by Thomas F. Lucy in Chemung County, New York. Red triangles ▲ represent areas of taxa listed as endangered, threatened, or unknown for the state of New York. Green circles ● represent areas for taxa recommended for protection.

Lucy-Master database using ArcMap 10.3.1 (ESRI 2011) indicate: 1) all known collecting locations (Fig. 7), and 2) possible locations of those plants recommended for protection (Fig. 8).

Although Chemung is the smallest county in the state of New York, Lucy felt it had a “fairly good flora” for its size in comparison with other counties in the state. He divided the county into five sub-floras—the

Chemung River and its alluvial flats, the creek bottoms, the woodlands, the swamps and low grounds, and the ponds—and discussed the rare species in each area. He commented on the habitat destruction of Eldridge Lake and on the interesting flora found at Lowman's Swamp (Lucy 1891). In some cases, Lucy's reports on the plants he had found are more detailed than the labels provided (Lucy 1881, 1882, 1883a, 1883b, Torrey Botanical Society 1881).

CONCLUSION

In addition to increasing knowledge of taxonomy and systematics, natural history collections in museums and herbaria are used for building understanding of impacts of global change on humans and nature, assessing biodiversity, developing conservation priorities, and other applications.

The greatest threat to the variety of species found on this planet is habitat loss. Even Lucy noticed habitat loss during his collecting in Chemung County. He commented, “The primitive flora of Eldridge Lake has been almost completely destroyed by the park there made,” and he observed that it may have been the only “station” for species no longer found (Lucy 1891). Housing in southern Elmira has always surrounded Miller’s Pond and Ward 8. Sullivan Hill is now part of the Newtown Battlefield State Park, with some clearing near the monument. Mt. Zoar Hill, Mountain House narrows, Van Etten Swamp, and areas around East Hill are still relatively

undeveloped. Hurricane Agnes caused the Chemung River to overflow its banks in 1972 and may have changed the plant communities along its course.

However, there is some good news for Chemung County. Dr. Steven Young, and later Dr. Steven Clemants, then of the New York State Natural Heritage Program, used the Lucy herbarium at Elmira College (ECH) to investigate areas for rare plant species. Working under Clemants' direction, Grebleski et al. (1992) conducted a preliminary survey in 1988 of about 48 known sites where Lucy collected in Chemung County, and concluded that the condition of the Chemung Valley at these Lucy sites were still in the same condition 100 years later.

Although Lucy's collections were not originally georeferenced and some of the place names have changed, integrating his locality descriptions with historical maps, publications, and Google Earth®, has provided useful location data in Chemung County, NY. With the completion and provision of an annotated checklist containing all the Lucy collections made in Chemung County, their localities, dates, and where the collection is now housed, as well as georeferenced "starting points," researchers and conservationists can begin to seek out possible surviving populations of these rare and endangered plants of New York State and to implement conservation strategies. (Table 2 – For the protection of potential sites and plants, spatial coordinates are not given in this report, but will be available at BH.)

APPENDIX

Annotated checklist of plants collected by Thomas F. Lucy, in Chemung County, New York.

This annotated checklist is a compilation of the plant specimens collected by Thomas F. Lucy in the Chemung County area of New York from 1866 to 1900. Label information was databased from collections housed at the J.F. Bell Museum of Natural History Herbarium (ABSL), Cornell University (BH), Brooklyn Botanic Garden (BKL), Boise State University (Boise St U), Buffalo Museum of Science (BUF), George Safford Torrey Herbarium (CONN), Royal Botanic Garden Edinburgh (E), Elmira College (ECH, now housed at BH), Field Museum of Natural History (F), University of Michigan (MICH), Missouri Botanical Garden (MO), W.S. Turrell Herbarium (MU), C.E. Bessey Herbarium (NEB), New York Botanical Garden (NY), New York State Museum (NYS), Ohio State University (OS), Muséum National d'Histoire Naturelle (P), University of Wyoming (RM), University of Missouri (UMO), U.S. National Herbarium (US), University of Wisconsin (WIS), and SEINet, a consortium of herbaria databases from the United States. Updating the nomenclature came from various resources (see literature cited) and the synonymies (original identifications in the collection) placed in **bold**. The New York State Natural Heritage Program (NYNHP) publishes a two-part code that ranks species based on global (G) and state (S) rarity that is also used by The Nature Conservancy (TNC). Global rankings are G1 (globally imperiled) to G5 (globally secure); GH (historical, but may be rediscovered), and GX (extinct). State rankings are S1 (critically imperiled) to S5 (demonstrably secure); SH (historical, but may be rediscovered) and, SX (presumed extirpated). (For more explanation of ranks and codes, see Young 2010, 2017.) New York State status (Mitchell and Sheviak 1981; Mitchell and Tucker 1987) of endangered (E), threatened (T), or unknown (U) has been noted. The plants are listed by family, current name, rarity status (State and the NYNHP/TNC code), collection locality, date, T.F. Lucy collection number, and herbaria where deposited. Spatial coordinates are not in this report for protection of potential sites and plants. Unidentified specimens (indet.) or unresolved taxa are at the end of the family or at the end of the checklist. Locations enclosed by brackets [] were added by the author based on other collections on the same date. Pro parte [p.p.] after the collection number indicates a mixed collection (several taxa on one page).

Lucy did not use consecutive collection numbers, as is the general practice today. His collection numbers varied according to his needs or those he exchanged with, and included Heller (1898), Oyster (1888), and Patterson (1895) checklist numbers; Mann's (1872) "cat. no.," a "coll. no." or a collection number that would be used for a species regardless of the place or date that specimen was collected; or no number at all (i.e., s.n.). The collection number in the checklist includes authors to other checklist(s) when possible. Occasionally, only labels and notes remained in the newspaper, so a question mark (?) denotes distribution in the checklist.

A primary goal of this inventory of the Lucy collection was to document the occurrence and possible locations of rare and endangered plants, and those considered recommended for protection for the state of New York. The list is arranged by Phyla/Division and alphabetically by family and taxa. Taxa of conservation concern are indicated by "§" for rare and endangered and by "*" for recommended for protection.
